

October Nursery Newsletter

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Welcome to October's Nursery Newsletter, we are delighted at how well the children have settled into Nursery. The children have enjoyed staying for their school dinner each day, please book your child's dinner by Sunday evening each week via the School Money App. Our topic for October is 'Autumn' where we will be learning about Autumn as a season, looking at how our surroundings are changing, the weather is getting colder and the nights are getting darker. We encourage you to go on an Autumn walk with your child and on seesaw we will send home a list of things to look out for!

During October we will be encouraging children to be able to do the following:

- Put on own coat for outdoor play and attempt to zip it closed
- Change from school shoes to welly boots for outdoor play (Velcro school shoes are preferred as children are unable to tie their own laces at this stage)
- Continue to follow the nursery play and dinner routines
- Continue to follow the Golden Rules and Good Sitting Rules for quiet room time.

School Dinners

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It is important that you go on to the School Money App each week to book your child's school dinner for them in advance. Even if your child is entitled to a free school meal, you must book their meal via this system.

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Getting Ready to Learn

We are delighted to take part in the Education Authority's Getting Ready to Learn programme each year. This year we have secured funding to continue our 'Big Bedtime Read' and 'Ages and Stages' programmes. We have also secured funding to begin the 'Happy Healthy Kids' programme. After half term we will begin the 'Big Bedtime Read' where children will choose two books to take home each week for their bedtime story. A baseline monitoring form from the Education Authority will be sent home for parents to complete. Please fill this in and send it back to your child's class teacher by Friday 15th October. This helps the EA to evaluate and monitor the successfulness of the programme each year. Further details about the other programmes will be sent home later in the year.

October Parent Teacher Meetings

Due to the latest guidelines we will be holding telephone parent teacher meetings during the week of 18th -22nd October. Please let your child's class teacher know if you require an interpreter for these meetings.

This is a great opportunity for you to find out how your child has settled and the progress that they are making in their learning. Nursery will close for all children at 1pm each day in order to facilitate these meetings.

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
